How to Register Your Happier Camper

Getting your camper registered is a breeze. Follow the information on this guide to make sure you're prepared to get your Happier Camper on the road for your first adventure.

Most states require Recreational Vehicles to be titled and registered the same way as other motor vehicles. In the meantime, your camper has a temporary tag which is valid for 21-days after pickup or delivery. Some DMVs may add a penalty to your registration if you exceed this 21-day limit.

Fees and tax assessment vary by state. Be sure to check the requirements for registering a Recreational Vehicle with your local DMV's site.

Note: VIN number verification will also be required. Your VIN number is located on the front curbside part of your frame.

California Sales Tax: if you are registering your camper in California, you will not have to pay sales tax at the time of registration because we are a manufacturer, not a dealer. Below is a checklist detailing the types of documents a DMV may require to register your camper.

All documents will be given to you in your Welcome Packet when your camper is picked up or delivered. All of these documents supplied by Happier Camper should be brought with you when registering at your local DMV.

What to Bring

- 1. Your new Happier Camper
- 2. Manufacturer's Certificate of Origin (MCO)
- 3. Bill of Sale
- 4. Sales Contract
- 5. Paid Invoice
- 6. Out-of-State Sales Tax Form (outside California only)
